### POSTCARDS FROM STATEWIDE MEETINGS

Took a quick trip to Imperial Valley via the Zoom Express to attend the March Statewide Meeting in Imperial County. Arrived late and missed the beef cooking demo on Friday night. Rose Tryon, President, welcomed all. We were greeted by County Supervisor, Ryan Kelley. He shared that Imperial County was the last to join California in 1907. Imperial County is in the southeast corner of the state bordering Arizona and Mexico. There is an abundance of water from the Colorado River, providing for the nearly 400,000 acres of production agriculture. Agriculture includes orchards, fruits, field crops and cattle. Ryan commented on the high rate of poverty in the county. The meeting was held during the months of mild temperatures (October to April) and not when it is 126°F in the shade.

Barbara LaVake, CWA State Legislative Director, filled us in on the recall campaign and prospective candidates, redistricting, and appointees both local and national. Barbara's knowledge and passion for California government and politics is always enlightening. Barbara encouraged CWA members to become the Legislative Director position in the near future. She inspired us with a How a Bill Becomes Law:101. It was a great refresher that led into the newly proposed legislation she suggested we watch.

Patrick O'Dowd, Salton Sea Authority Director, spoke about the varying issues impacting the Salton Sea water basin, including, ecology, recreation and water quality. Patrick expounded on the fact that with increased salinity the effect is decreased fish and bird populations. He also said the water flowing into the basin from Mexico is not subject to the same regulations under WOTUS. This was a huge surprise and he said the water is super polluted.

Quick trip, yet it was great to see familiar faces from around California.
